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Ready to Roll



Thanks to the continued efforts of the Roseville Historical Society and the support of the Roseville community the relocation of Locomotive 2252 is happening this month!

The Community Coalition for the Relocation of Locomotive 2252 has been working since September 2002 to move this historic train to the intersection of Vernon and Atlantic Streets. The Roseville Historical Society needed to raise approximately \$100,000.00 to finance the refurbishment, removal, and relocation of the locomotive.

Although a significant amount of fund-raising must still be done in order to complete the new display site, enough money has been raised to put the proverbial wheels in motion. Roseville's development and business community has generously stepped forward and supported the project. The City of Roseville Redevelopment Agency has also agreed to fund a series of improvements to the property upon which the locomotive will be displayed.

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Seal the Deal

Vernon Streetscape - New streets mark the final item being checked off the Vernon Streetscape project list! This work completes the \$3.8 million streetscape project on Vernon Street. The contractor is applying the slurry seal and final striping Saturday, October 2 and one additional date to be determined. Civic Plaza Project - Kobra Properties, the developer of the Civic plaza Project, presented information to the Central Roseville Revitalization Committee last month comparing the height of the proposed four-story office building to that of the Tower Theater. The height of the proposed four-story office is 60 feet to the top of the parapet and 68 feet to the top of the mechanical screen. The design of the proposed building makes it very difficult to see the mechanical screen from the street. The peak height of the Tower Theater is 71 feet at the top of the marquee. The committee

Plans take shape

The second public workshop for Riverside Ave streetscape was September 20 with 15 business owners, residents, and interested citizens in attendance. EDAW, the consulting group, was on hand to unveil a proposed plan for the streetscape.



overview of key elements the steering committee wanted included in the plan. They also discussed the budget and what was involved in preparing a streetscape design. EDAW identified two key sites on Riverside that could be used for larger developments and showed what types of projects could be developed on the sites.

Other plan highlights presented were:

- increasing the parking from 318 spaces to 537, including the possibility of a central parking lot on Cherry St.
- a roundabout in the intersection of Vernon, Douglas, and Riverside and bulb-outs along the street to make Riverside Ave more pedestrian friendly.

After EDAW's presentation of the plan they invited the group continued on page 3...



Update

The Redevelopment Agency unanimous (RDA) gave its approval of the conceptual design for the Historic District project on August 18. The design team submitted 30% design plans to the city for review on Monday, August 30th. To date, the project is meeting the project time-line for submittals and approvals. City staff anticipates having comments from all departments compiled for the design team's review by September 24th.

City staff continues to explore the possibilities of developing the Union Pacific (UP) land behind the Barker Hotel into a railroad themed park or open space. A public meeting will be held, as promised, once city staff has a better understanding of the opportunities and constraints that exist for this concept. In addition, the design team and the traffic-engineering department are working identifying any existing issues if all the parking on Lincoln Street, between Pacific and Main Streets. is converted to diagonal parking. to get a closer look at the proposed streetscape. During this portion of the meeting the group was able to ask questions and express concerns. The main concerns brought up by the group were pedestrian crossings at the roundabout and left turns off of Riverside. EDAW will make adjustments to the plan incorporating comments as possible.

The next steps for the project are to finalize the streetscape plan and present it to the Steering Committee on October 18th. EDAW will then complete the specific plan and begin the Environmental review.

Bay Equipment and Repair (BEAR), was contracted to clean, prep, and paint the locomotive at its current Placer County Fairground display site. On September 10th BEAR removed the protective tarps and unveiled a freshly painted locomotive. The physical relocation will be completed by mid-October.

consensus was that the height of the proposed four-story office is consistent with that of adjacent and surrounding buildings. A fourstory office building allows for a quality design using steel frame construction and incorporation of many windows. A restaurant is proposed for the ground floor of the office building. The four-story office building requires additional parking in the associated parking garage increasing the total number of spaces from 520 to 553. The garage will provide parking for employees of the office building, City of Roseville employees, and general public parking uses. The garage also includes a ground floor art gallery fronting Vernon Street anticipated to be operated by the Roseville Arts Center. This proposed project continues to be reviewed by city staff to complete the final design elements. Construction is anticipated to begin spring of 2005. The photo below is a schematic of the project and does not represent the final design.
