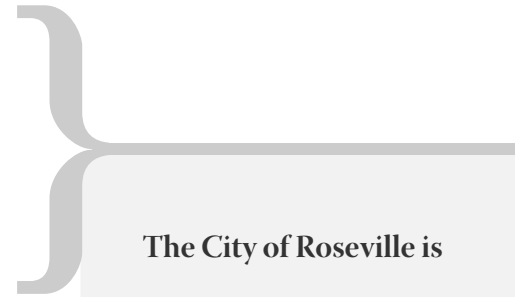


Be Prepared!
