W-51 Public Workshop #1 Meeting Minutes

I. Introductions

Purpose of the Meeting

- This was the first City of Roseville public meeting designed to review the planning process for the neighborhood park site (W-51) off of Symphony. The purpose of this meeting was to discuss the park planning process, the budget and rough schedule, the park program for amenities, and gather public input.

II. Park Planning Process

- Rjahja Canlas reviewed
 - The park planning process, which is on average a 24 month process,
 - The purpose of the sketch included in the specific plan (space planning and budget development), and
 - The budget (\$900,000 for construction).

III. Review of the Specific Plan Concept

The plan contained in the specific plan is a high level document intended to be more of a space planning exercise and to develop a budget.


III. Comments/Questions/Concerns

- What is the size of the park?
 - The total park parcel is 4.7 acres
- Will the park be open 24hrs/day?
 - Parks are open from Sunrise to one hour after sunset.
- Will there be a play area for tots?
 - Generally, we will build play areas for children ages 5 to 12 years. This is because the play value is greater. The tots will play in the small area, which

has to be a separate space, for a very short time and then want to play with the “big kids”. Due to tight budgets, the play value is greater to build one larger play area that can address a wider variety in ages than two smaller ones, which impacts the budget.

- Will there be restrooms?
 - Typically, a neighborhood park does not have a restroom included. The “Stay and Play” value of the neighborhood park is about an hour and is within walking or bicycle distance from home. With the costs of a restroom building, other amenities would have to be eliminated in order to stay of budget.
 - A show of hands indicated that there was no support to include a restroom.
- What is the estimated start / finish timeline for construction?
 - We are targeting Spring/Summer 2019.
- Has a name already been selected for the park?
 - The Parks & Recreation Commission has approved the name *Richard and Pauline Rocucci Park*, and will go before City Council for approval at the January 10th meeting.

Ideas were collected and attendees were provided three dots to prioritize desired amenities.



Next Steps:

The sketch will be developed given the feedback from this meeting. Upon completion, a second workshop will be conducted for further feedback. Email notices will be sent to those who have attended the past workshops as well as to the Westpark and Fiddymont Neighborhood Associations for distribution.
