I. Introductions

Purpose of the Meeting

- This was the second City of Roseville public meeting to review an updated park concept sketch based on the feedback we received at the first public workshop.

II. Overview

- Rjahja Canlas reviewed
 - The feedback the City received in Workshop # 1 regarding park amenities such as
 - Playgrounds
 - Shaded Structure
 - Zipline
 - Paved Walking Path
 - Adult Fitness Equipment
 - Multit-use turf areas
 - Picnic benches
 - Pickleball court
 - The proposed name for the park: Richard and Pauline Roccucci Park
 - The budget (\$900,000 for construction).
 - Park development is approximately a 2 year process from the first workshop to completion.
 - Construction is a 6-9 month process (weather dependent)
 - After completion of construction a 3 month establishment period must take place before the park opens
 - Revealing of proposed park design

- At the completion of the meeting, attendees indicated their approval of the park plan by a unanimous show of hands

III. Comments/Questions/Concerns

- Are suggestions closed at this point for the park amenities?
 - Our goal is to get any concerns and move forward. We have performed a needs assessment throughout the City to evaluate trends and we put those trends into consideration during park design. We have also included amenities that were prioritized in the First Workshop. However, there will be a two-week write-in period where you can still make comments.
- Are there going to be drinking fountains?
 - There will most likely be one drinking fountain.
- What type of adult fitness equipment will be put in?
 - Body weight exercises to do stations such as push-ups and step-ups.
- Will there be any facilities and amenities such as lights and a sound system for organized sports?
 - There will be no lights or sound systems for facility usage. There will be security lights throughout the park.
- What is the estimated start / finish timeline for construction?
 - We are targeting to break ground in Spring of 2019.
- How will the public know what time the park closes?
 - The park will close 1 hour after sunset. There will be signage to communicate the closure time.
- What age does the playground structure cater to?
 - The playground structure is designed for 5-12 year old children
- Is there a theme for the play equipment?
 - There is not a theme at this time. The landscape architect will consider the name sake and other factors to develop a theme.
 - There was a suggestion for a music theme in keeping with the street name theme of the neighborhood
- Is there an area for bike parking?
 - Not at this time but we can consider a bike rack if it is within budget.
- Is there a sidewalk that goes through the park?
 - There is not a sidewalk that goes through the park, it is only around the perimeter and then connects with the bike path on the back side of the park.
- Are there safety features for the zipline?
 - We are looking at different manufacturers for the zipline at this time. There are wood fibers in place below the zipline to help cushion a child's fall.

Next Steps:

The sketch will be revised given the feedback from this meeting. Upon completion, a two week write-in period will open. The revised colored draft master plan will be posted online and feedback would be requested from all. We encourage all feedback, including support of the plan and additional comments.

This will help us determine if we move forward for formal approval or not. In a recent write-in period, we had little feedback so we held a third workshop. When residents were asked, they all liked the plan and wondered why we were gathering. Without feedback, we did not have enough information to determine support.
