Trash and green waste

About your service

Trash is collected weekly and green waste is collected every other week, Monday through Friday. The collection day depends on where you live in the City. Trash must be set out at the curb by 7 a.m. for pickup. Please place your green waste container in the street with your garbage container. Be sure to leave at least 4 to 6 feet between your garbage and green waste container as well as all the way around the can.

What goes in the green waste bin?

- Prunings (less than 4" in diameter and cut to fit inside)
- Leaves
- Grass clippings
- Christmas trees (unflocked and cut to fit inside)

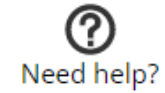
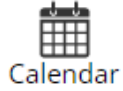

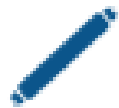

☰ Household hazardous waste

State law prohibits many common household items like paint, batteries, electronics, sharps and medications from being placed in your bin. Keeping these items out of your bin helps protect the environment and the people collecting and sorting your waste, and allows our sorters to focus on recovering more recyclables. These items can still be easily disposed or recycled – find an option that works for you!

Waste Services: Programs & Services

Free door-to-door Collection for U-waste

- **Batteries** - Household and automotive
- **Fluorescent Lights** - tubes and bulbs
- **Thermostats** - mercury containing devices like thermometers
- **Electronics** - TVs, computers, monitors, printers, stereos, cell phones

The following items must be sealed in a plastic container and clearly labeled

- **Cooking Fats, Oils and Grease**
- **Motor oil and filters**
