

# **CITY OF ROSEVILLE 2008 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT**

## ***FUNDING UNDER THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT OF 2009***

The City's Substantial Amendment to its 2008 Annual Action Plan identifies additional funds received under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (Recovery Act).

This document identifies the activities the City will undertake using CDBG Recovery Act (CDBG-R) funding.

### **TOTAL CDBG-R ALLOCATION:**

**The City of Roseville's total allocation of CDBG-R funds is \$137,550.**

The City plans to use CDBG-R funds for energy efficiency improvements to facilities privately owned by local non-profit agencies that are located within the city limits of Roseville, and who provide services/programs to low-income Roseville residents.

The City must ensure that 70% of its CDBG-R grant be expended for activities that benefit low and moderate income persons.

### **ACTIVITIES TO BE UNDERTAKEN:**

#### *Community Development Block Grant Funded Activities:*

The City will undertake the following activities funded with CDBG-R funds during the 2008 Program Year:

#### ***Public Facilities and Improvements:***

**\$123,795** – *Energy Efficiency Improvements* – for Privately Owned Non-Profit Facilities Located within the City Limits of Roseville

#### ***Program Administration and Planning:***

**\$13,755** - *General Program Administration and Planning Activities*

### **GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION:**

The programs/activities identified in the Substantial Amendment to the 2008 Annual Action Plan will primarily target older facility(ies), located in lower income neighborhoods, and serving low-income Roseville residents. The facility(ies) to be assisted will be located in a block group(s) defined as low-income neighborhoods (at least 51% low-income) Roseville Heights, Theiles, Enwood, Los Cerritos, and Vineyard given the age of the structure(s) and high energy usage, as verified by Roseville Electric.

### **PROGRAM INCOME:**

The City does not anticipate receipt of Program Income from these funds during the 2008 Program Year. Any Program Income received from CDBG-R funds will be allocated to the Housing Rehabilitation Program to provide grants and loans to low-income Roseville residents.

### **MONITORING:**

The City will monitor its performance for the 2008 Program Year through the Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) mandated by HUD. The City will review and report the progress it has made in carrying out the activities identified in the Action Plan. The CAPER will include a description of resources made available, investment of available resources, geographic distribution and location of investments, families and persons assisted, actions taken to affirmatively further fair housing and other actions indicated in the amended 2008 Action Plan.

In addition to HUD's mandated monitoring and reporting requirements, the City will continue to monitor its sub-recipients through formal agreements with the sub-recipients. The agreements will outline requirements of the sub-recipients, including submission of quarterly reports, site visits by City staff (if applicable) and Federal overlay requirements.

### **CITIZEN PARTICIPATION PROCESS:**

On May 27, 2009 City of Roseville published a public notice in the local newspaper, *The Roseville Press Tribune*, and also sent out an email notification to the Placer Collaborative Network (PCN) and Placer Consortium on Homelessness (PCOH) ListServ groups that provide services to low-income residents.

The document is available for public review and comment at the following locations:

Copies of the document will be made available to the public free of charge within two days of a request.

A public hearing was held on June 3, 2009 to present the amendment to the 2008 Annual Action Plan explaining eligible uses of funds and the proposed activities that will be funded with the use of these funds. This hearing provided the public an opportunity to comment and discuss the proposed activities.
