

C. Doulton Burner Park

Dedicated October 13, 2007

Clarence "Doulton" Burner was born and raised in Foresthill. He moved to Roseville in 1938 when he married his wife Lorraine. One of the highlights of his life were daughters, Susan and Karen. He owned and operated the Credit Bureau of Placer County.

Roseville meant a great deal to him. If there was a local charity that needed help, he would volunteer his time, whether it was fundraising or as a master of ceremonies. He helped raise money to build Roseville Community Hospital and was a past member of its Board of Directors. He was also co-chairman of fund raising to help build Sutter Roseville Medical Center.

He served for many years on the Board of Directors of the Roseville Telephone Company (SureWest). He also co-founded the local Foothill Savings and Loan, which eventually merged with Placer Savings and Loan, where he served on the Board of Directors. He co-founded and was Vice President and Member of the Board of Directors of Rocklin Sunset National Bank, which later became Placer National Bank in Roseville, serving as

Vice-Chairman of the Board of Directors.

Burner was a member of the Roseville High School Board of Trustees and an officer and long standing member of the Roseville Chamber of Commerce. He was past President of the Placer County Chamber of Commerce and a member of the Placer County Civic Olympic Committee for the 1960 VIII Winter Olympics, where he represented the Chamber as a host. As an Auburn Dam Committee member, Burner invited to witness and attend President Lyndon Johnson's signing of the Auburn Dam Bill. He was a member of Roseville's Sierra View Country Club since its inception. Burner was also a past President and the longest surviving member (over fifty years) of the Roseville Rotary Club.

He sponsored numerous Little League teams and throughout his lifetime received many accolades and awards for service above self. Burner passed away in 2005 at the age of 90.
